

Amended Notice of Joint Public Hearing

NOTE: The New York City Department of Education (NYCDOE) has amended the Educational Impact Statement (EIS) for this proposal due to clerical errors on page 3 and in table 2 (page 6) where the enrollment data for Bill Lynch and P.S. 153 were inadvertently switched. The correct enrollment data for both schools can now be found on page 3 and in table 2 on page 6 of the Amended EIS. No changes have otherwise been made to the Amended EIS or amended notices for this proposal.

The Proposed Grade Expansion of The William Lynch School (06M368) from a K-5 School to a K-8 School in Building M153 Beginning in the 2024-2025 School Year

A Joint Public Hearing will be held to provide the public with an opportunity to learn more about the above-referenced proposal and to present comments or concerns on the proposal. The date, time, and location of the hearing are as follows:

This Joint Public Hearing will be an opportunity to learn more about potential changes to building M153 and share feedback.

The NYCDOE is proposing to expand the grades served by The William Lynch School (06M368), referred to as Bill Lynch, from a K-5 school to a K-8 school beginning in the 2024-2025 school year. Bill Lynch is a district elementary school currently serving students in grades K-5 as well as in 3-K and pre-Kindergarten (pre-K) programs in building M153. M153 is located at 1750 Amsterdam Avenue, New York, NY 10031 in Community School District 6, referred to as District 6. Bill Lynch is currently colocated with P.S. 153 Adam Clayton Powell (06M153), referred to as P.S. 153, a district elementary school serving students in grades K-5 as well as in 3-K and pre-K programs. M153 also houses the Community Based Organizations (CBOs) Boys and Girls Club of Harlem, Harlem Dowling, and The Harlem Hellfighters.

If this proposal is approved by the Panel for Educational Policy (PEP), Bill Lynch will expand to serve grades K-8 as well as 3-K and pre-K programs. Bill Lynch will add sixth grade in 2024-2025 and will continue to phase in one grade per year until it serves grades K-8 in the 2026-2027 school year and reaches full enrollment scale in the 2027-2028 school year.
